

Dr. Robert Levin. Before joining the CPUC, Bob had an extensive career in PG&E's Rates Department and related areas. Bob sponsored the utility's marginal cost studies, especially the marginal customer and distribution costs underlying PG&E's rates. He also had significant witness roles in such specialized rate proceedings as gas storage, cost separation, revenue cycle services, standby, line extension, and gas rate cases.

While in ORA, Bob sponsored testimony on marginal cost, revenue allocation, and rate design in various cases, for all three large electric IOUs. Bob was the ORA project manager and policy witness for the SoCalGas AMI proceeding. In 2011, he authored a white paper: "Time-Variant Pricing for California's Small Electric Consumers." Bob has presented at several Rutgers School of Business CRRI conferences over the years, including two papers on rates for electric vehicles and two papers on TOU rates.

Bob taught as an assistant professor at Bernard Baruch College in New York. He holds a Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Mathematics from UCLA and UC Berkeley, and a Ph.D. in Operations Research from UC Berkeley.
